Backboards will be available from the school office at a cost of \$3.00 each. Backboards are not allowed on school busses and must be picked up by parents to be transported home.

Project Fair

Participation in the Project Fair is optional, however, students are encouraged to enter a display or project. The project fair will include a variety of project categories: Creative Writing, Research, Science, Heritage, and Mathematics.

Grade 3, 4 & 5 students:

Students at these grade levels are invited to participate in the project fair. A student may choose to complete an individual or group project (maximum of 2 students) in French or in English. The projects at this level will be judged, and projects will be chosen to represent École Bannatyne at the Divisional Science Fair on April 13th and at the Heritage fair in May.

Students wishing to participate in the Project Fair must complete an entry form and the guideline booklet for that category will be made available to them. The registration form must be returned to the homeroom teacher by February 4th, 2010.

NB. Science and Heritage Fair projects considered for the Divisional and Regional Fairs must be on a project backboard.

Project Guidelines:

Creative Writing:

Students may enter a story or poem. Short stories must be 2-12 pages in length. They may be presented in a book format. Poems must be a minimum of 14 lines in length. Legibility, style and grammar will be considered. Students must also provide their rough drafts.

Mathematics:

Students may enter a project or display, which displays their mathematical knowledge. They may complete a survey, make a graph, make a chart,

draw a map of an area or demonstrate a specific skill or collection of data.

Research:

Students may complete a project, which includes a display, photographs, diorama or information about a chosen topic.

Science:

Science projects must focus on scientific content. Students may choose to prepare an experimental project, which investigates a question using the scientific method. They may also complete a non-experimental project, which can take the form of a display, model, research, collection of data or collection of items.

Grade 4 & 5 students must prepare their projects in French.

The grades 3-5 students who decide to work on a Science project will be considered for the Divisional Science Fair.

Heritage:

Heritage Projects must focus on Canadian Heritage and celebrate an aspect of Canada's history. It can take the form of a display, model, research, song, or performance, collection of data or interview.

The grades 4 & 5 students who decide to work on a Heritage project will be considered for the Regional Heritage Fair. This project can be done in English or in French.

All projects can be done in English except for the Grade 4 & 5 Science projects. Should you have any questions, please contact the school at 888-1101.
